Homily Corner



Last weekend we celebrated the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 19, the second reading was 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 and the Gospel reading was Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21.

Three years ago, Pope Francis declared this day the Sunday of the Word of God. We are created by God, in his image and wisdom. God, the Word, goes

on and on. It is living. We celebrate the Word this Sunday as we kick off our year of the Gospel of Luke. At the beginning of Advent, I reminded you of which Gospel we would be concentrating on this year. All the Gospels are great and they all focus on different needs of the people. Luke explains that he went through all the records to write his Gospel and so the Church says that his Gospel is for everyone.

We are blessed by the Holy Church today with amazing readings. They all have scientific, historical and traditional aspect staying in them. In the first reading, we see that the Word of God existed from the beginning. And even though this service of the assembly of the people of God happened in 968BC, centuries and centuries before Jesus, there is not much difference from then to today. They kept the Word of God in scrolls. The service was not just one hour. There were many readings and interpretations. Many scribes, the highly elite and educated people, were appointed as lectors. They would do a reading and then a homily after. When the interpretation was given, the people who listened and understood would sometimes weep with joy or sorrow. When they wept with sorrow, it was a sorrow of conversion. They were also reminded to be joyful, because it is the Lord's day. We saw the scribe proclaiming God's word from an ambo, which still happens today. Historically these were made out of wood. The history of proclaiming the Word has remained the same. When we are confused by the homily, it is because we don't take that Word of God to heart. We don't cry with joy or sorrow. And then sometimes just one small Word of God gets to us. We need to focus on the Word of God.

One of the great homilists of the Church, Saint Francis de Sales, was speaking to priests when he told them that after listening to a homily, the people shouldn't be leaving the Church saying what a good homily it was. Instead, the people should be asking what kind of transformation can they do. What kind of change can they make. A homily should touch your life and demand conversion.

In the Second Reading St. Paul is affirming that God the Holy Spirit made each of us in such a way that all of us makes up one body. He explains it very well. We are given different gifts, but all of those gifts are given to us by the same Spirit and all those gifts come together for the fullness of creation. That is the power of the Word of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims the Word of God. And when he is finished, he says, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." Just like Jesus had a personal experience today, when we open the Bible when we are sad, distressed or joyful, we will be given an answer.

This week, as you spend time in quiet prayer, reflect on the power of the Word of God in your life. Take time each day to read the Bible.

Lenten Bible Study

The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy

If God's people had stayed close to him, there might have been no need for the prophets. God sent prophets at critical times to call the people back to their covenant relationship. Prophets proclaimed the consequences of continued sin, called people to repentance, and declared God's faithful love. They also spoke of the future to shed light on current events and to reveal God's plans and purposes.

It is nearly impossible to understand the work and the message of Jesus without the prophetic books. In *The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy*, presenter Thomas Smith examines who the prophets were, their role during their time, and the meaning of their messages for our own time. Discover how God is constantly calling you to a deeper relationship as well as the ways you are called to be the voice of God to others.

Participants of *The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy* will meet every Thursday to view an engaging video presentation followed by a question and answer group discussion. Our *Prophets Bible Study* will begin on Thursday, February 24. There will be one session, each

Thursday at 7:00pm. The sessions will end on April 7.
