## **Homily Corner**

This past weekend we celebrated the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Jeremiah 17:5-8, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 1, the second reading was

1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20 and the Gospel reading was Luke 6:17, 20-26.

The Holy Scriptures: when we listen to, read, pray and utilize them, they are the blessedness of God. In our world today, we have many concerns and we talk of the world losing faith, but the Bible is still the greatest book in the world. It is a best-seller. It is translated into every language. And there is a reason the Holy Bible is so respected and loved; it tells us the truth. Truth is beauty.

The readings today speak of certain challenges for us. In the first reading, the Prophet Jeremiah speaks about trust in God. Sometimes we feel like there is not substance in our lives or in our families. The reason for that is that we don't trust in God. We haven't transformed in the way the Holy Scripture tells us to. We may go to Church regularly, but still live in our own sins. When we trust in God, we can have the power to transform and be washed of our sins.

We may be faithful, going to Church and praying, but in the Gospel reading today, Jesus tells us the truth. And as we have talked about before, what do you like to hear: a pleasing lie or a prevailing truth? He says, "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false Prophets." We are clearly warned of false Prophets. They will please us but won't give us any life. If we can take our lives away from evil and the tempter, and live in the Word of God proclaimed by the Prophets, we will be transformed.

The season of Lent always begins with Jesus in the desert. That is because we go from dryness and darkness to joyful life through this season. It is an opportunity to turn to God more fully.

The first part of today's Gospel is very interesting. Jesus came with his apostles and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people. It says, "Then Jesus looked up at his disciples and said: Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh." The most important line in this Gospel reading is, "Then Jesus looked up at his disciples." He tells them they are blessed, but he does not say this to the whole crowd. The disciples are cleansed, but he was not sure about he crowd. They were to listen to the second part of the Gospel. I also want to mention that when we hear the word rich in the Holy Scriptures, we might think about finances, but in the Bible, richness means absence of grace. It means being rich in sin, exploiting people, cheating, lying. When you come to Church and receive the sacraments, you are poor for Jesus. You are thirsting and hungry for Jesus.

We may be blessed like the disciples, but we have the responsibility to reach out to others to help them transform. We need to reach out to our community, our family and our friends. By transforming ourselves and reaching out to others to help them transform, the kingdom of God expands to the whole world. This is the role of the disciples, the Prophets. We are proclaimers of the Word of God, which will give us truth and life.

As you spend time in quiet reflection this week, contemplate your trust in God. In what areas of your life could you trust more fully in your loving Father? How can you be a disciple, a prophet of God by reaching out to others?

Wednesday. Traditionally, pancakes or other foods made with milk, eggs, and fat are eaten that evening as a last feast before the fasting of Lent.


Everyone is welcome for supper. Holy Mass will be celebrated following supper at 7:00pm with the burning of the palms for Ash Wednesday.

#### The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy


If God's people had stayed close to him, there might have been no need for the prophets. God sent prophets at critical times to call the people back to their covenant relationship. Prophets proclaimed the consequences of continued sin, called people to repentance, and declared God's faithful love. They also spoke of the future to shed light on current events and to reveal God's plans and purposes.

It is nearly impossible to understand the work and the message of Jesus without the prophetic books. In *The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy*, presenter Thomas Smith examines who the prophets were, their role Iduring their time, and the meaning of their messages for our own time. Discover how God is constantly calling you to a deeper relationship as well as the ways you are called to be the voice of God to others.

Participants of *The Prophets: Messengers of God's Mercy* will meet every Thursday to view an engaging video presentation followed by a question and answer group discussion. Our *Prophets Bible Study* will begin

on Thursday, February 24. There will be one session, each Thursday at 7:00pm. The sessions will end on April 7.

#### <u>Discern - Plans for Gathered Information</u>

All information will be submitted to the Regina Archdiocese by May 9th, 2022. The Archdiocese will then use the information to submit a document to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB).

In 2022, the CCCB will develop a national synthesis document summarizing its key findings. The national synthesis document along with contributions from the local churches will be sent to the General Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops in Rome for review and setting direction for the Catholic Church into the future. In 2023, the outcomes of the Synod will be published and released.
