Homily Corner

This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the Third Sunday of Lent. The first reading was Exodus 20:1-17, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 19, the second reading was 1 Corinthians 1:18, 22-25 and the Gospel reading was John 2:13-35.

As we have been doing during Lent, my homily was sent out to you by email to read and reflect on. I hope you are enjoying the time for reflection as we journey through this holiest of seasons. We continue with our theme of refashioning and remoulding our image into the

Today, I want to take a quick moment to explain something in the scripture readings. We often look at the people around us and wonder why someone who does not go to Church, does not believe in God

doesn't face the challenges and struggles we face. They seem to be happier and more joyful than us.

We are very familiar with the first reading today. The story of Moses receiving the Ten Commandments. But we often overlook a line in the middle of this reading. "You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments."

Maybe one of the reasons we struggle and face challenges is because we are being held by our ancestors sins. That hold can be delivered by prayer and our works of mercy. That is what the season of Lent is for. Every sin, even personal ones, are really social. Our sins affect the generations to come and we are affected by the sins of our ancestors before us. This season is our opportunity to be delivered from that hold. Lent is a remedy for our hold to be delivered, a time for liberation and deliverance. God tells us that when we pray to him, when we worship him, he will bless the generations to come for 1000 generations.

We tend to recognize the blessings only. When we were baptized, we were cleansed from original sin. The sin of Adam and Eve. We are all born with that sin. But then we pray to "The God of Abraham" and "The God of Jacob". Our forefathers, Abraham and Jacob brought God's blessings into our lives. We have received both the responsibility of our ancestors sins and the blessings originating from our ancestors. How do we untie the bondage we are in so God can deliver us? We can look at the collect. "O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen." God is mercy, but in order for us to receive that mercy we need to do certain things: fasting, prayer, works of mercy and charity. It isn't a volunteer thing for him. Doing these things will give us a remedy for sin and make us a remedy for others.

As you spend time in quiet prayer and reflection this week, ask yourself how you can liberate your family from that hold? How, through prayer, fasting and works of charity and mercy, can I be a remedy?

Holy Mass Updates

We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking out for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:

- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- It is mandatory that you self-isolate for 14 days when you return from travelling internationally.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- Masks are mandatory and social distancing will be adhered to.
- If you would like a copy of the Directives for Attending Holy Mass, please contact Connie.
