Homily Corner

We are in the middle of the joyous Easter Season, celebrating the Risen Lord, and I am happy to be back to sharing my homily with you. Last weekend, we celebrated the 3rd Sunday of Easter. The first reading was Acts 5:28-32, 40b-41, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 30, the second reading was Revelation 5:11-14 and the Gospel reading was John 21:1-19.

In all three readings today, we are experiencing the unconditional love of Jesus. We see the days after the Resurrection, where Jesus is very busy appearing to his family, the disciples, the apostles and his friends. We will see this same theme until the Ascension.

The people's faith has deepened and expanded since the Resurrection. Before the Resurrection, many people believed that Jesus was a miracle worker, but they still had concerns and questions about him. After the Resurrection, they began to believe. Jesus was so busy, reassuring them, helping their faith to grow, by giving them the Spirit of God. Let us look to the opening prayer: "May your people exult for ever, O God, in renewed youthfulness of spirit," The youthfulness of spirit that Jesus was sharing is our healing, our joy. And that is the power of the Resurrection. Those people who were believers became disciples.

In the Gospel reading, we see the disciples gathered near the Sea of Tiberias. They are desperate and lost. They had been following Jesus for the past three years and now he had left them. Peter, the leader of the disciples, told them that he was going to go back to his family trade—fishing. They went with him. Now, at that time, fishing was not a high tech endeavor. The fishermen would be out on their boats, casting nets, and the elders of the community would walk along the sea shore and call out to the fishermen. "How is the catch today?" They knew the signs of fish and would help the fishermen. "Move your net to the other side!" As the disciples were fishing, they heard someone call out to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" The disciples did not realize it was Jesus calling to them. He tells them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." There are two theological meanings for the "right" side. The first is literal, that Jesus was telling them to cast their net on the right hand side of the boat. The second meaning is "go the right way" or "do the right thing". The right way is keeping God with you in all that you do. As I said, the disciples were desperate, heart broken, lost, and they did not have God with them. Once they listened to Jesus, they caught more fish than they ever had. They needed help to haul the nets to the shore. When they had Jesus with them, their catch was abundant.

Many times, we cast our nets without Jesus. Some people are believers, but not disciples. When we don't keep Jesus with us, our efforts will be futile. We will not be fruitful. By discerning and praying, our discipleship will grow and by keeping Jesus in everything we do, the Kingdom he established will be enjoyed by all.

This week as you spend time in quiet prayer, ask yourself, "Am I a believer or a disciple of Jesus? Am I allowing the Risen Lord in my net? Am I keeping God in my work, my family, my free time?

Holy Mother of the Savior, at the foot of the cross you mourned the death of your only Son.


Bless and embrace the loving parents of all priests, deacons, brothers and sisters.
