

### Directives for Attending Holy Mass and Adoration

We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking out for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:

- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. If you have any symptoms, even if they are mild, such as a fever, sore throat, cough, headache, aches and pains, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, please do not come to the Church. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- It is mandatory that you self-isolate for 14 days when you return from travelling internationally.
- Masks are mandatory and social distancing will be adhered to. Once you have been seated, please remain in your seat except to go to the washroom or to get a drink of water from the water cooler in the main entrance of the Church. Also, please do not walk through the pews.
- Please limit what you bring with you to Church. One small bag and one prayer book is fine. Please do not bring bottles of water, cups of coffee, or any other food or drink with you.
- If you have been exposed to someone with the virus, please do not come to Church for 14 days after the exposure.
- After the final blessing and dismissal at Holy Mass, please remain in your pew until our hospitality ministers can guide you to leave the Church while maintaining social distance.
- If you would like a copy of all the Directives for Attending Holy Mass, please contact Connie.

### **Homily Corner**



Last weekend, as we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we reflected on one of the biggest mysteries of our faith. The first reading was Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 33, the second reading was Romans 8:14-17 and the Gospel reading was Matthew 28:16-20.

Today we have another amazing celebration of our liturgy and our faith, the Most Holy Trinity. The celebration of the Holy Trinity is the most important

profession of our faith. It is difficult to profess the Holy Trinity because it is a mystery. While we will never understand our unfathomable faith, we can deepen our faith and strengthen our spirituality.

If you have God with you, Jesus and the Holy Spirit are with you as well. They are an inseparable Godhead. A few months ago I explained making the sign of the cross and I am so happy that everyone is earnestly praying this perfect prayer of the Trinity at the Holy Masses. Praying this prayer with the understanding of what it means will bring us many graces. When we touch our forehead we are reminding ourselves of God the Father, the seat of wisdom. When we touch our heart we think of Jesus who is unconditional love. And when we touch our shoulders we recall the Holy Spirit and his might and power.

I also want you to reflect on our sacraments. They all have the Trinity format. We baptize in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Jesus intentionally said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." When we go for confession, we are absolved in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We are assured in our faith by the power of the Trinity.

When we celebrate the Holy Trinity we also must look at the creation story. God the Father initiated creation. Then he used the Word of Truth, Jesus, to create everything in love. But creation was not finished. It was in chaos, not organized. Then the Holy Spirit hovered over the earth and organized the chaos. He separated the nights and days, the land and sea, and organized the fruits and the stars and everything. And God saw that it was good. We will not be able to see anything without the Trinity.

After the chaos of creation, the Holy Spirit organized everything and we had the sun. God is the light. And all light radiates bringing resplendent grace to the world. God is the light that radiates through Jesus and the Holy Spirit brings resplendent grace to us. We receive this grace through prayer. What we seek, wish, pray for is granted to us by God the Father through the Son in love and sanctified by the Holy Spirit. We are filled with sanctifying grace. May that resplendent grace spill over the whole world.

The Trinity is undivided unity, inseparable love and intimacy. And we are invited to join them. In John 17:21 Jesus prayed, "that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me." We are called to be a part of the inseparable, undivided union. And within that relationship, God will never abandon us. He will be with us always, till the end of time.

As we reflect on the Holy Trinity, contemplate God the light, Jesus the radiance and the Holy Spirit as the resplendent grace. May we always be intentional in our prayer to the Trinity.
