Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost and the first reading was Acts 2:1-11, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 104, the second reading was 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 and the Gospel reading was John 20:19-23.

This is a very special weekend for the Church and the whole world. Today, we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit. We have been preparing for this great Feast for the past few weeks and are now ready to be recreated in the image of God by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is the one who is with us today. We receive our gifts and graces through the Holy Spirit. We need only to look at the sacraments of the Church to see the importance of the Holy Spirit. In baptism, the priest invokes the Holy Spirit by saying: "We ask you, Father, with your Son to send the Holy Spirit upon the waters of this font." And before the child is anointed with the oil of chrism, the priest prays, "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit." We are reborn by the power of the Holy Spirit. And in confirmation, we receive the fullness of God's Spirit. The Holy Spirit is our guide, our protector and our shepherd. He gives us the gifts we need on a daily basis.

In today's Gospel, we see the disciples gathered in fear when Jesus appears to them. He reassured them that he was truly the Lord and then he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." The disciples were renewed. They became fearless and were able to accomplish that they were called for.

The Holy Spirit has always been. The Spirit existed before creation, so visible, but not touchable at the beginning of creation. Without the Holy Spirit, creation would not have been possible. When we read the first chapters of Genesis, we see that creation was in a kind of chaos and the Holy Spirit hovered over creation and step by step everything was organized (and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters" - Genesis 1:2). Then at the end of the creation process, God created humanity. He formed man from the dust of the ground. As the Great Architect, he shaped man out of clay. But man was lifeless. So God breathed into the man's nostrils the breath of life and the man became a living soul. He breathed the Holy Spirit into man.

We also know of the Holy Spirit's presence from the beginning because when God had created everything but man, he said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness;". (Genesis 1:26) We see that God used the plural words, us and our. That is because the Holy Spirit was there and was part of the creation. God has aways been the Triune God.

God breathed the Spirit of life into humanity. Jesus the Risen Lord breathed the Spirit onto the fearful disciples. And that very same Spirit is with us in the world today.

This week as you spend time in quiet prayer, contemplate the power of the Holy Spirit. Pray to the Holy Spirit in gratitude for the gifts of guidance, protection and love that we so generously receive.
