Directives for Attending Holy Mass and Adoration

We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking out for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:

- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. If you have any symptoms, even if they are mild, such as a fever, sore throat, cough, headache, aches and pains, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, please do not come to the Church. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- It is mandatory that you self-isolate for 14 days when you return from travelling internationally.
- Masks are mandatory and social distancing will be adhered to. Once you have been seated, please remain in your seat except to go to the washroom or to get a drink of water from the water cooler in the main entrance of the Church. Also, please do not walk through the pews.
- Please limit what you bring with you to Church. One small bag and one prayer book is fine. Please do not bring bottles of water, cups of coffee, or any other food or drink with you.
- If you have been exposed to someone with the virus, please do not come to Church for 14 days after the exposure.
- After the final blessing and dismissal at Holy Mass, please remain in your pew until our hospitality ministers can guide you to leave the Church while maintaining social distance.
- If you would like a copy of all the Directives for Attending Holy Mass, please contact Connie.

Your cooperation with all these items allows us to celebrate safely. Thank you!!

Homily Corner



Last weekend, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi. We reflected on another great mystery of our faith. The first reading was Exodus 24:3-8, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 116, the second reading was Hebrews 9:11-15 and the Gospel reading was Mark 14:12-16, 22-26.

For the last little while we have been celebrating some awesome feasts in the liturgical year: Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity and today we celebrate the perfect culmination of all these great feasts and of each Mass the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Vatican II told us that the Eucharist is the source and summit of life. Today, I want to focus on Church teachings so we understand that source and summit. Everything in our lives derives from this altar and we should never think we are done contemplating the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. Everyday more of the strength and love of the Holy Masses revealed to us Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote an Apostolic Exhortation called Sacramentum Caritatis, which is translated as The Sacrament of Love. He wrote many encyclicals and is a very holy man full of wisdom. In The Sacrament of Love, he shares three facets of the mystery of the Eucharist. I would appreciate you memorizing the three facets.

- #1. The Eucharist, a mystery to be believed. During the consecration, the Holy Spirit is invoked by the priest to descend upon the gifts and transubstantiate the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. And after the consecration, we proclaim the Mystery of Faith. When we think of Holy Mass, sometimes we think it is all about Jesus. We hear Jesus' words in the Gospel, we pray the prayer Jesus taught us, at communion we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. This is all true, but the Holy Mass is always a celebration of the Holy Trinity. All our blessings come from the Trinity. It is a sacrifice of Jesus, but it would not be happening without the Holy Trinity. We have all heard of the bread come down from heaven, but the Eucharist is not manna from heaven, it is a free gift of the Blessed Trinity. If there was no Holy Spirit, we would just be eating bread and wine. The Blessed Trinity is full of the Holy Eucharist and the Holy Eucharist is given to us through the Holy Trinity.
- **#2. The Eucharist, a mystery to be celebrated.** We come to the Church to pray, worship and adore. And when the real presence of Jesus is exposed for venerable adoration, that is the time to be silent and adore. But when we come to the Church for Holy Mass, we must understand that the Holy Eucharist is a celebration, a banquet. That is why the Eucharist is called a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. We come together as one family in Christ to show love of neighbor and by doing this, God's love will go through us. Holy Mass should be joyful. Prayer, praise, worship and adoring the Lord are components of the Holy Mass, but we must always remember Holy Mass is a Celebration .
- **#3. The Eucharist, a mystery to be lived.** At Holy Mass, we receive the Word of God, the life of Christ, the whole Jesus. And we are called to proclaim Jesus in our daily lives. We have to show compassion, mercy and share the teachings of Jesus and the Church. That is our mission. By living the Holy Eucharist in our daily lives, we bring fullness to our belief. Every time we celebrate the Holy Mass, we are professing our faith.

Believe. Celebrate. Live.

As you reflect on Corpus Christ, how does your life proclaim Jesus? Are you swearing, wanting to go first, thinking only of yourself? Or do you show compassion and mercy to those who are in need? How do you leave each Holy Mass changed and ready to witness?
