Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time and the first reading was Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 51, the second reading was 1 Timothy 1:12-17 and the Gospel reading was Luke 15:1-32. The following is my homily:

This weekend, Jesus presents us with three very interesting parables. The story of the lost sheep, the story of the lost coin and the story of the Prodigal Son. These parables are very familiar to us as we always hear them and reflect on them during the season of Lent. So today, I am going to talk to you about our Parish Family.

Last weekend, we talked about the Economy of Salvation, the household management of God's gifts. To invest in the Economy of Salvation, we must have a mission and a vision in our personal lives, our family life and any organizations we belong to. We are investing in the Kingdom, in eternal life.

And just as we need to do that in our own lives, together we need to invest in our Parish Family. For the past five years, we have been building a Parish Mission and Vision. And, together we have grown so much. We have many new ministers, many new programs running, many opportunities to grow in our faith.

So now, we take the next step. This next year, we are focusing on our financial stability. And throughout the year, from time to time, you will hear some of our Parish Family members talk to us about investing in the Kingdom. How can we prepare ourselves for eternal life? When we look after our Parish Home, we will be blessed to be happy and God will be happy. This is the Economy of Salvation. I urge you to go back and read last week's homily. And I encourage you to also read the sacrament section in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The Economy of Salvation is explained very well there.

As we strive to secure our personal life, with health plans, insurance, etc., we need to plan for the future. We must also ask ourselves how we are planning to invest in eternal life. As a Parish Family, it is our responsibility to look after our Parish Home. How do we want St. John the Baptist Parish to be in 25 years? Even though I will no longer be the pastor here and many of you may not be here either, we need to make sure that our Parish is sustainable for the future. That is our goal. That is our vision. We are moving forward pastorally and now we need to move forward financially.

So, I have three things for you to contemplate on this week:

- 1. Am I as generous to God as he is generous to me?
- 2. How can I help my Parish Home to be sustainable?
- 3. Am I a giver (do I have envelopes)? If I am, how much do I give? When was the last time I increased my giving?

As members of this Parish Family, we are each called to look after our Parish Home. And together, we can make sure that our beautiful parish is here for many, many years. We are called to invest in the Kingdom of God. We are called to build the Kingdom of God.

St. John School Revitalization Project Plans

St. John the Baptist Parish is happy to clarify and confirm the plans for the contributions for this project. The focus at this time is to re-pay the loan for \$151,000.00 from one of our very generous parishioners for the purchase price of the building and re-assess at that time.

Last year, we offered a survey as a means to provide our parishioners the opportunity to voice their ideas and opinions with regards to the potential future plans for this property. The results are included below.

- 70% stated that re-acquiring the school would help promote growth within the Parish
- 62% stated that St. John School should be re-acquired
- 75% stated that they would like to see the building renovated and repurposed for additional Parish programming or services

The previous plan for the building was for it to be turned into a seniors housing project. Moving forward, once the original loan is repaid, some preliminary ideas that we have come up with for possible uses of this space are:

- 1. Construction of a columbarium storage of cremation urns.
- 2. Development of a Bible study program and extend an invitation to surrounding parishes to participate.
- 3. Construction of a facility with a commercial kitchen and event space for our parish and community to rent, possibly for wedding receptions, reunions, conferences, etc.
- 4. Create a space for CWL, The Knights of Columbus, Youth Ministries, Seniors groups, etc. to hold meetings, functions and social events.
- 5. Demolish the existing school or part of the school for now with the potential to develop in the future.

Now that we have full ownership of the building and property, we can ensure that it will be used to benefit not only our Parish, but the community as a whole.

We want to thank and bless those who have reached out to us with questions as well as those who have already sent in their contributions. With your continued support, we can continue to move forward with the plans the Lord our God has for us and our Parish Family.





ST. JOHN'S SCHOOL REVITALIZATION PROJECT

We are very excited to announce our St. John's School Revitalization Project. We have several options on the future use of the building and as such need your continued generosity to make these plans a reality.

The building was purchased with the generous help of interim financing by a parishioner. The cost of the building and plans for future development totals \$250,000.00. We were very lucky to be able to acquire the property for less than half the amount of taxes owing on it. As such, this is where we are looking to you, our generous parishioners, to help us make these plans a reality!

We would like you all to prayerfully consider the financial needs of your church. Our parish exists to provide a spiritual home for all of our parishioners and with this new property, we will soon be able to provide even more facilities and services to benefit you, our parishioners.


Decorating for Thanksgiving

FALL BIBLE STUDY

Have you ever been unable to explain the "why" of Catholic beliefs? Have you ever wondered why the Old Testament sounds so different from the New Testament? In the Old Testament, God began building a plan and laying a foundation for the beautiful traditions of the Catholic Faith. That plan was fulfilled by Jesus in the New Testament. *Fulfilled: Uncovering the Biblical Foundations of Catholicism* is an apologetic approach to sharing the Catholic Faith using the Old Testament Tabernacle as a blueprint for God's plan. While it is designed as a faith-sharing Scripture study, you will also gain an understanding of some of the most questioned Catholic teachings. *Fulfilled* will reignite your love of Scripture and help you share and defend the Catholic Faith with the Word of God.

This is an eight week study, with sessions being held on Thursdays, beginning on October 6 and ending on November 24. We are offering two session times each Thursday: 1:30pm and 7pm. Please choose the session time you will attend. And of course, you may switch session times according to your schedule.


Each session will begin with an introduction to the theme of the day, a video, small group discussion and an opportunity for questions and answers.
