Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time and the first reading was Amos 8:4-7, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 113, the second reading was 1 Timothy 2:1-7 and the Gospel reading was Luke 16:1-13. The following is my homily:

Last weekend, our Finance Council spoke at both Holy Masses about how we are caring for and considering our Parish Home. I concluded by raising three questions for your contemplation. The good new is that some of our Parish Family have already contemplated, prayed and planned how they can help with their Spiritual Home and the St. John School Special Project. We also had some of our Parish Family asking for clarification about last week's bulletin insert. I welcome your questions. Your questions will make our councils more productive and creative. In this week's bulletin, we have some more information for you. Last spring, we did a survey and your active, positive involvement encouraged the council to go ahead with obtaining the property. This was important to the majority, especially considering that if someone else bought it, we may never reacquire it. In the future, we will have one or more Town Hall Meetings so you can bring your creative ideas about what to do with the property. Right now, our priority is to pay back the generous family who purchased the property and to call in engineers to check the structure of the building. We welcome any questions, concerns, and valuable advice as we move forward.

In today's Gospel, Jesus concludes, "You cannot serve God and wealth." All of us, in one way or another, are consumers and sellers. We share and we receive. Is Jesus asking us not to be wealthy? No, he never will. In fact, he tells us to go and multiply the grace he has given us. We are to multiply our God-given grace. When he said that we cannot serve God and wealth, he was telling us that if we are only going with wealth, it comes to be Idol Worship. We are fools if we think that we made everything. We didn't. God has given us everything. We are to enjoy all our blessings, multiply them and share them, while keeping God with us at all times. We are called to use creation in such a way as to bless us. Think about the stones of the earth. They are created in the earth, under the earth for a reason. If you keep these things, worshipping them, it is Idol Worship. But if you use these things for your happiness, healing and adoring the Creator, that is Ideal Worship.

Going back to the first reading, the prophet Amos is talking about how the people worshipped Idols. He is talking on behalf of them, asking when the full moon will be over. In some cultures today even, nothing can be bought or sold during the full moon. They wanted the full moon to be over so they could offer wheat for sale, measuring out less and charging more. It was unjust and unrighteous. That is why Jesus came. Because of the injustice and unrighteousness in the world. He came to challenge us and call us to be just and righteous.

God is shared with us and then we have the responsibility to share our God-given gifts with others, those in need. This is how we invest in our everlasting life.

Do you enjoy the gifts God has given you? Do you multiply those gifts and share them with others? Are you investing in the Kingdom of God on earth? Are you investing in your eternal home?

St. John School Revitalization Project Plans

St. John the Baptist Parish is happy to clarify and confirm the plans for the contributions for this project. The focus at this time is to re-pay the loan for \$151,000.00 from one of our very generous parishioners for the purchase price of the building and re-assess at that time.

Last year, we offered a survey as a means to provide our parishioners the opportunity to voice their ideas and opinions with regards to the potential future plans for this property. The results are included below.

- 70% stated that re-acquiring the school would help promote growth within the Parish
- 62% stated that St. John School should be re-acquired
- 75% stated that they would like to see the building renovated and repurposed for additional Parish programming or services

The previous plan for the building was for it to be turned into a seniors housing project. Moving forward, once the original loan is repaid, some preliminary ideas that we have come up with for possible uses of this space are:

- 1. Construction of a columbarium storage of cremation urns.
- 2. Development of a Bible study program and extend an invitation to surrounding parishes to participate.
- 3. Construction of a facility with a commercial kitchen and event space for our parish and community to rent, possibly for wedding receptions, reunions, conferences, etc.
- 4. Create a space for CWL, The Knights of Columbus, Youth Ministries, Seniors groups, etc. to hold meetings, functions and social events.
- 5. Demolish the existing school or part of the school for now with the potential to develop in the future.

Now that we have full ownership of the building and property, we can ensure that it will be used to benefit not only our Parish, but the community as a whole.

We want to thank and bless those who have reached out to us with questions as well as those who have already sent in their contributions. With your continued support, we can continue to move forward with the plans the Lord our God has for us and our Parish Family.

FALL BIBLE STUDY

That plan was fulfilled by Jesus in the New Testament. *Fulfilled: Uncovering the Biblical Foundations of Catholicism* is an apologetic approach to sharing the Catholic Faith using the Old Testament Tabernacle as a blueprint for God's plan. While it is designed as a faith-sharing Scripture study, you will also gain an understanding of some of the most questioned Catholic teachings. *Fulfilled* will reignite your love of Scripture and help you share and defend the Catholic Faith with the Word of God.


Each session will begin with an introduction to the theme of the day, a video, small group discussion and an opportunity for questions and answers.
