Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was 2 Kings 5:14-17, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 98, the second reading was 2 Timothy 2:8-13 and the Gospel reading was Luke 17:11-19. The following is my homily:

On this Thanksgiving weekend, the Holy Church blesses us with readings that follow the theme of the weekend. Gathering today, we celebrate the most important family celebration—the Eucharist, which actually means thanksgiving. The readings give us the theme of thanksgiving in a special way. When we celebrate Thanksgiving in the light of the Holy Scriptures, it should be more than thanksgiving. It should be gratitude. Thanksgiving is always good, but gratitude is always better.

We have been taught by our parents and we have taught our children that when we receive something, we say thank you. And that is great. But there is a difference between thanksgiving and gratitude. Gratitude comes from the heart. The Church talks about an attitude of gratitude—the whole body and soul in action to show gratitude.

In the Gospel reading, ten lepers who were Samaritans, approach Jesus, asking for mercy. He tells them to go and show themselves to the priests. And as they continued on their journey, they were healed. One of them turned back and praised God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. Jesus said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well." The Samaritan, not only thanked Jesus, he showed gratitude. His heart, body and soul was in action. And Jesus blessed him. He was healed and blessed. Jesus was not going to take back the healing from the other nine. He would never do that. But the one who came back was healed and saved.

Jesus talks about gratitude in every parable. And we know that people who are grateful are happier and more resilient. We need to be grateful to God and to one another. The commandment of God through Moses was that when you show gratitude, you should go to the temple to give thanks and praise God. Returning to God in gratitude brings you the grace of God to be saved. And the saving is immortal. When we love God, believe in him, have faith in him and him alone, we are a people of gratitude and we will be saved.

In your prayer time this week, contemplate the difference between thanksgiving and gratitude. How can you be more grateful?
