Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Exodus 17:8-13, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 121, the second reading was 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2 and the Gospel reading was Luke 18:1-8. The following is my homily:

This weekend is a continuation of the gratitude weekend we celebrated on Thanksgiving Sunday. We reflected on the difference between thanksgiving and gratitude. Thanksgiving is great, but gratitude is even better. Gratitude is the whole body and soul in action.

And we see Jesus continually expressing gratitude. He travelled throughout the land, preaching to the people and performing many miracles. The crowds following him grew and grew and after he spoke, they wanted to still be with him. But most times, they could not find him. He would leave the crowd, go up to a mountain or to a clearing and pray. He always gave gratitude to the Father for his ministry, his abilities and his very life.

Our first reading today is a beautiful story about the power of prayer. The people of Israel were in a war with Amalek. Moses told Joshua to "Choose some men for us and go out, fight with Amalek." Joshua did as Moses told him, choosing some men and fighting the heathen king and his army. But not only did they physically fight, their most important weapon was prayer. Moses and two assistants went up the hill where Moses held up his hands and prayed. While his hands were raised, Israel prevailed. But when his arms grew weary and he had to lower his hands, Amalek prevailed. Finally Moses' assistants made him sit on a stone and they held up his hands for him while he prayed. Joshua defeated Amalek.

Moses was the one holding up his hands because he was the anointed one. We don't see his assistants raising their arms in prayer. But, and now this is very important, through the sacrament of baptism, we are anointed Priest, Prophet and King through Christ.

At one point in the Holy Mass, the priest says, "Lift up your hearts." We respond, "We lift them up to the Lord." An uplifted heart will never be declined. I see many people lift their hands in prayer during the Our Father. This is an awesome way to lift your prayer to God. It is a posture of gratitude and intentional prayer. We come to Church with our family, who have the same intentions and desires, and what a beautiful way to pray together, by holding and raising your hands as a family. Even when you are at home, alone, in prayer, raise your hands. Show your gratitude to God in a big way.

In the Gospel, we also hear about the power of prayer. Jesus tells us to pray without ceasing. If the unjust judge who doesn't care about God or the people can still give the widow justice, imagine what God, the true, just judge, can grant us.

In your quiet time this week, keep in mind when you are praying, at Church or at home, that God will shower upon you even more than you can ask for. Raise your hands and pray intentionally, without ceasing for your desires.

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection

1st Reading: Sirach 35:15-17, 20-22 2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18 Gospel: Luke 18:9-14



Today is World Mission Sunday, which reminds us of the missionary activity of the Church. The first reading from Sirach reminds us that God does not have any favorite people and hears the cries of the vulnerable and marginalized.

St. Paul reminds us to that even those who have no one to stand up for them are still held in the Heart of the Lord, echoing Sirach in our duty to ensure solidarity with the oppressed, the poor, the marginalized, the strangers.

The Gospel hits us hard—do we sometimes want to distance ourselves from others? Do we place ourselves on a pedestal? Do we become blind to the needs of the poor and the world? We sometimes think of missionary work as being done in a country far away, detached from our lives. There are many ways of being a missionary in our communities, both in terms of our own generous response to the Lord in working in that ministry, but also in our support of those missionaries near and far. Through the Annual Appeal, your contributions are used to help support the missionary activity of the Church. We need to reach out to those that have not heard the Good News of the Gospel, and your support helps make this a reality.
