Holy Mass Updates

We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking out for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:



- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you are required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, you are required to wear a mask to church.
- Social distancing will be adhered to.
- If you would like a copy of the Directives for Attending Holy Mass, please contact Connie.

Homily Corner

This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the 29th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The first reading was Isaiah 45:1, 4-6, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 96, the second reading was 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5ab and the Gospel reading was Matthew 22:15-21.

The last three weekends, Jesus asked questions, making the Pharisees answer correctly. He then told them to be like their answers, to live what they are speaking.

This week and next week, the Pharisees ask Jesus a question. This was a kind of trap that the Pharisees had set up for him, but he answered them correctly. They asked him, "Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" Jesus knew what they were up to and he replied, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites.....Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

Pope Francis wrote a new encyclical that was released on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the feast day of his patron saint. The encyclical is called *Fratelli Tutti*, which means Fraternity of Brothers. In this encyclical, Pope Francis talks about our responsibility to our brothers and sisters, to care for all. We are called to be co-creators with the Creator God. We are called to bring creation to perfection.

This week, Archbishop Donald released a message that also talked about our responsibility as citizens. He shared how we can build up our city and our country by leading them to fulfillment.

The Gospel tells us that we have to develop and take care of our communities. We are citizens of the Kingdom of God and this is why we have this responsibility to speak up, to transform and care for every part of God's creation. We do this by looking after our communities, paying our fair share, and taking care of those who need our help. We express the gratitude for the gifts God has given us by sharing them with others. Maybe it's taking time to listen to someone, maybe it is praying for our brothers and sisters that are in need of prayer, maybe it is exercising our right to vote.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, ask yourself, how do I show that I am a citizen of the Kingdom of God? How do I share the gifts God gave me with my community and the world?
