## **Holy Mass Updates**

- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- Masks are mandatory and social distancing will be adhered to.

## **Homily Corner**



This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the Second Sunday of Advent. The first reading was Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 85,

the second reading was 2 Peter 3:1-8 and the Gospel reading was Mark 1:1-8.

We are reflecting on the beginning of the Gospel of Mark during Advent. Last week, the First Sunday of Advent, we heard three very important instructions: watch, wait, and keep awake. This week, we have a little bit of a hike in the message of Advent. This week, we are instructed to prepare in all the readings.

Preparation is necessary for every one of our actions to be fruitful. We begin preparing by using the gift of wisdom we received at baptism. The Holy Spirit empowered us with this important gift. We are called to be a people of enlightenment. And that is why this week of preparation is given to us. Through the use of the gift of wisdom and when we use our imagination, God's light will shine on us and through us to the whole world.

In the beginning, when mankind first sinned, God told them that they needed to repent, prepare and plan. He said that when these things were being done by his children, he would send his only Son, Jesus, to be with them. He told his children that if someone was attacking them, he would protect them, safeguard them. They waited and waited, anticipating the coming of the Messiah. We, too, are waiting for Jesus' coming. Even though right now we are in darkness, when we prepare for the light to come, it will come. God promises us that he will never abandon us. He will never orphan us. By our good actions, our preparing, the light of Christ will shine upon us.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, examine your life and pray and discern about where you need to prepare more in your life. How can you use the gift of wisdom and your imagination to prepare?


