A message from Archbishop Donald Bolen Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Warm greetings of peace and joy to you in this Jubilee Year of 2025!

This jubilee year is called the "Pilgrimage of Hope." We are reminded that we have hope not because of our own strength, but because of the joy and strength that comes from a life in God. God is not a passive observer of human events, unemotional and unmoved. God is a living actor and doer, who actively engages in

our history and who invites us to do likewise. God is a friend of all who are oppressed, including and especially those on the margins. God does not stand idly by as injustice is spread, but rather stirs the hearts of people to respond to injustice and to be artisans of the peace that God desires. In the Old Testament, we read that God decreed that every seven years there would be a jubilee year to promote justice among the people. During a jubilee year, slaves would go free, the land would rest, and debts would be forgiven. In this way, we see one of God's many provisions to care for the created world and to restore justice to the impoverished among us. In the first act of his public ministry, Jesus chose to announce the year of the Lord's favour, the jubilee year, so that we could live in right relationship with one another and with our God.

Pope Francis has summoned the Universal Church to celebrate this year as a year of jubilee, and challenges us: if we really wish to prepare a path to peace in our world, let us commit ourselves to remedying the remote causes of injustice, settling unjust and unpayable debts, and feeding the hungry. These are noble goals, but also necessary goals, as we acknowledge that today, 3.3 billion people in our world live in countries where the cost of their national debt is higher than what they can afford to spend on education and health care. Countries in the Global South spend $12 \frac{1}{2}$ times the amount on interest of their national debts than they do on adapting to climate change - this despite the fact that they are often the least contributors to, but most impacted by historic greenhouse gas emissions. It is clear that debt has placed a heavy burden on the people of these nations, who often look to wealthier nations, such as our own, as those who can lessen their burdens and allow them to go free.

It may be tempting to give in to despair of all these gigantic debts - ecological, financial, and spiritual - debts that engulf so many in our world; but this is not the way of our Lord. Jesus's way is a way of hope, hope that leads to engagement. In response to the Holy Father's call for justice this jubilee year, Caritas Internationalis has launched the campaign "Turn Debt Into Hope," a campaign that will be promoted in the 162 Catholic national aid agencies operating in 200 countries around the world. Development and Peace - Caritas Canada participates in this worldwide campaign as a member of Caritas Internationalis and contributes every single day as they deliver life-saving and life-giving aid through their vibrant partnerships all over the world. Their annual report reveals 11.2 million people being reached through 79 different community projects in 34 countries. But more than by providing life-changing aid to those in need, this year we are invited to "Turn Debt Into Hope" by signing a petition exhorting our elected leaders to forgive debts, provide debt free financial aid for climate change adaptation, and build a truly just debt framework at the United Nations.

Our participation in this campaign is a key way that we can be a part of the "year of the Lord's favour" that Jesus proclaimed. We can help others to believe and know that Jubilee lives today, 2,000 years later.
