Bible Study

We are so excited about the next Bible Study on "Psalms: School of Prayer" beginning on Thursday, September 24th, 2020.



We hear the Psalms read or sung at every Mass between the first and second readings, but do we understand their significance?

The Psalms are at the heart of the Bible. They are prayers from God that help us learn to pray. The Holy Spirit inspired them. Israel sang them. Christ himself prayed them, as did our Blessed Mother. These sacred hymns become our heartfelt response to God's loving and wondrous deeds for us. *Psalms: The School of Prayer* is an eleven-week Bible study that will explore how the words of the Psalms captivate the imagination and draw us into a deeply personal encounter with God.

Participants of *Psalms: The School of Prayer* will meet every Thursday to view an engaging video presentation followed by a question and answer group discussion. Our *Psalms Bible Study* will begin on Thursday, September 24, 2020. There will be two sessions, one at 1:30pm and the other at 7:00pm. The sessions will end on December 3, 2020.

The registration will be limited to 30 people per session due to the Covid restrictions, so you'll want to register early for *Psalms*. It's going to be great!

Completed registration forms along with the \$60.00 registration fee can be placed in the collection basket at Holy Mass, dropped off at the Parish Office or you may call the Parish Office to make arrangements to register.

Directives For Attending the St. John the Baptist Parish Bible Study

We are excited to be offering this Bible Study and can't wait to see you there!!

All those attending the Bible Study do so at their own risk. It is important for individuals and families to take responsibility for protecting themselves and others.

Before Coming To The Study:

You must do this self-assessment before you come to the Study. The self-assessment is subject to change depending on the current situation and it will be emailed to you each week before the session. When you arrive, you will be asked if you have completed the self-assessment. If you have not, you will be asked the following questions:

- Do you have Covid-19 or do you live with someone with Covid-19?
- Have you been exposed to someone with Covid-19?
- Have you recently travelled outside of Canada?
- Do you have a fever, sore throat, cough, headache, aches and pains, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Have you been a part of a gathering of more people than the Province of Saskatchewan recommends?
- Have you recently travelled outside of the province? The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- Have you had family visiting your home from other areas of the province or country? If
 yes, we ask that you seriously consider where your company has travelled from and who
 they have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you
 decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask
 during the 14 days from when you company arrived in your home.

If you answered yes to the first five questions, do not come to the Bible Study. Please contact Beckey Franke at 306-461-9559 to let her know you are unable to attend the session.

Entering The Church For Bible Study

- Only the front door of the Church will be unlocked.
- You will receive your workbook and nametag at the first session. Please bring this to every session. Otherwise, please keep what you bring with you from home limited.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the Parish Hall and you are also welcome to bring your own with you.
- All surfaces that are commonly touched will be disinfected after each session.
- Social distancing will be adhered to. The tables for each person will be set up 6 feet apart. Couples and family members can sit at the same table.
- Water bottles will be available as you come in for the session. We will not be offering coffee or tea during the sessions. A few candies will also be on each table.
- The sessions will begin with an introduction and opening prayer. Then we will watch the video followed by a question and answer period.
- Please touch as little as possible.

All Directives are subject to change depending on the Covid-19 situation in our area.

Holy Mass Updates

- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- If you have travelled to or through the West Central or Southwest parts of Saskatchewan in the past 14 days, we ask that you wear a mask to come to the Church.
- Social distancing will be adhered to.

Now they will have Sunday Masses at 9AM in Bienfait and at 11AM in Torquay. I will still be their pastor and will be looking after their spiritual and sacramental needs. The incoming priest will stay with me for a few months until his travelling options are opened. He has served this diocese for 10 years and now has to leave to return to his religious order. He helped the Estevan area a few years ago and lived in Estevan during that time. He is Father Anthony Padayatti. He will have no position as assistant or associate but will be like a visiting priest. Once he is gone, the Archbishop has another retired priest in place to continue with the same system.

Homily Corner

This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Isaiah 22:15, 19-23, the second reading was Romans 11:33-36 and the Gospel reading was Matthew 16:13-20.

We have finished two series of readings on the themes of The Kingdom of God and Miracles. God the creator give us certain names of privilege (treasure, pearl), because we are created in his image and likeness. And we have been reminded to "**Keep God First And Trust In Him**."

This week, both the first reading and the Gospel reading use the word 'key' and say similar things. The first reading talks about a replacement in administration. God tells the King he will replace him with someone who is very faithful. The new King's task is to attend to the needs of all the inhabitants of the realm like a father. God says that he will place the key of the house of David on his shoulder, what he opens will stay open, what he closes will stay closed.

In the Gospel, Jesus asks the apostles who do the people think that I am. They tell him that some people think he is John the Baptist, some think he is Elijah, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets. Jesus then asks them who do they think he is. He has travelled with them, they have witnessed his whole ministry, and he is curious as to what they think. Peter jumps up right away and says that he is the Christ, the Son of the living God. Peter is immature, we see throughout the Gospels how he always jumps into things before he thinks. Even so, because of his faith, his belief in Jesus as the Christ, Jesus tells Peter that on this rock he will build his Church. Jesus is pleased with Peter and he tells Peter he will give Peter the keys of the kingdom of heaven, what he binds on earth will be bound in heaven, what he looses on earth will be loosed in heaven. Giving Peter this key is a sign of his authority over God's household and of his position as steward of its resources.

So we see that with faith, even the immature, quick to respond person can receive the keys to Heaven. How happy God will be to give us the Key of Praise and Grace.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, contemplate who is Jesus in your life. Who is Jesus for me? If you have faith and truly give the answer of who Jesus is to you, he will give to you what he gave to St. Peter, the Key of Praise and Grace.

See you next week as we reflect on the 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time.




