

Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time and the first reading was Genesis 18:20-32, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 138, the second reading was Colossians 2:12-14 and the Gospel reading was Luke 11:1-13.

All three readings this weekend are very intimate and they all relate to our daily lives.

In the first reading, God was going to destroy the city of Sodom and Gomorrah because of their sinfulness and uncleanliness. He chooses to discuss this with Abraham, a man of great faith and a just man. Abraham pleads with the Lord to save the city. They go back and forth about how many righteous people would need to be in the city for the Lord to save it. The number drops from fifty to ten. Our focus should be on how we are counted and looked after if we live in God's image of love.

In the second reading, St. Paul tells us that Jesus came to redeem us and our transgressions were nailed to the cross with him. He explains how we can receive the intimacy of God's grace. We need to turn away from sin. We were delivered and saved by the Lamb being nailed to a tree. In some cultures, even today, when a family knows that they are sinful or a person knows they are living a life of uncleanliness, they will take a bird or animal and invest all their sins in the bird or animal. Then the priest or leader of the family will nail the bird or animal to the cross. After these prayers and the sacrifice, the family believes their sins are forgiven. This is one reason that we call Jesus the Lamb of God. He took on our sins and transgressions, was nailed to the cross and we were delivered. That is how we are blessed to be counted among the ten.

And then we come to the Gospel. Jesus gives us the most perfect prayer. He also reassures us that our prayers are heard. We need to pray for our transgressions and promise to never repeat them. Each of us are counted. Each of us are called and blessed. Even in our own lives as parents, while we might be impatient with our children at times, we still give them everything they need. So if we can do that, imagine how much more our heavenly Father will give to us. All we need to do is intentionally pray tirelessly and Jesus tells us that the Holy Spirit will be given to us.

This week, as you spend time in quiet prayer, ask yourself: Am I confident in God? Do I pray and do penance before seeking my needs in prayer?
