Homily Corner



This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the Fourth Sunday of Lent. The first reading was 2 Chronicles 36:14-17a, 19-23, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 137, the second reading was Ephesians 2:4-10 and the Gospel reading was John 3:14-21.

As we have been doing during Lent, my homily was sent out to you by email to read and reflect on. I hope you are enjoying the time for reflection as we journey through

this holiest of seasons. This week, the readings are about the light of Christ. May the light of Christ, lifted up for our salvation, shine brightly in us so that all we do may be done in God and be a witness to the power of God's love.

At the beginning of the Holy Mass today, we were blessed with a few announcements from our Parish Pastoral Council. Usually we would have our Annual General Meeting in the Parish Hall after a Holy Mass and go through the Annual Report, discussing and sharing our ideas, but this year we are doing our meeting a bit differently.

Last week, you received a copy of the Annual Report, either by email or in your pew at Holy Mass. Our Parish Family is growing and especially in these times, we are praying, discerning and journeying together in many ways, always reflecting on our Mission Statement and Vision.

And as I look forward to everything returning to normal, I ask you to pray and discern about serving in a ministry. We will need many more ministers when we can again gather without restrictions. As part of our Parish Family, it is our responsibility to share our God-given gifts in gratitude, returning them to him in a greater way. I think of King David and King Solomon. They both said that God had been immensely great to them and they hadn't done anything in return. They both wondered what they could do. God helped King Solomon to build the greatest temple. It took forty-six years. Solomon and David returned the grace of God in a worthy way. They are examples to us of how to give gratitude to our Father, who has blessed us tremendously. Just like the outside of the Church is built of bricks, when we serve in a ministry, we are the bricks of the body of Christ, His Holy Church.

As you spend time in quiet prayer and reflection this week, ask yourself how you can return God's blessings in a worthy way? How can you help to build up the Church?

This season in the Church begins with Holy Thursday and continues through Good Friday and Holy Saturday and ends on Easter Sunday. These services flow into one another and are full of beautiful rites and traditions. Following the Mass on Holy Thursday, we are all asked to leave the Church in silence. Adoration will be taking place in the Church until midnight that night. When we come to the Church for the Good Friday Liturgy, we are

asked to come in silence and to leave in silence again that day. We also begin the Easter Vigil in quiet and in the dark. These periods of silence are very meaningful in our journey through the Triduum.

Holy Mass Updates

We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking out for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:

- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- It is mandatory that you self-isolate for 14 days when you return from travelling internationally.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider whether it is safe for you to come to Church.
- Masks are mandatory and social distancing will be adhered to.
- If you would like a copy of the Directives for Attending Holy Mass, please contact Connie.

Your cooperation with all these items allows us to celebrate safely. Thank you!!
