### First Prayer

O Mary,

You shine continuously on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who, at the foot of the cross, were united with Jesus' suffering and persevered in your faith.

"Protectress of the Roman People",

you know our needs, and we know that you will provide, so that, as at Cana in Galilee, joy and celebration may return after this time of trial.

Help us, Mother of Divine Love,

to conform ourselves to the will of the Father and to do what Jesus tells us. For he took upon himself our suffering, and burdened himself with our sorrows to bring us, through the cross, to the joy of the Resurrection.

Amen.

We fly to your protection, O Holy Mother of God; Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from every danger, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.

### Second Prayer

"We fly to your protection, O Holy Mother of God".

In the present tragic situation, when the whole world is prey to suffering and anxiety, we fly to you, Mother of God and our Mother, and seek refuge under your protection.

Virgin Mary, turn your merciful eyes towards us amid this coronavirus pandemic. Comfort those who are distraught and mourn their loved ones who have died, and at times are buried in a way that grieves them deeply. Be close to those who are concerned for their loved ones who are sick and who, in order to prevent the spread of the disease, cannot be close to them. Fill with hope those who are troubled by the uncertainty of the future and the consequences for the economy and employment.

Mother of God and our Mother, pray for us to God, the Father of mercies, that this great suffering may end and that hope and peace may dawn anew. Plead with your divine Son, as you did at Cana, so that the families of the sick and the victims be comforted, and their hearts be opened to confidence and trust.

Protect those doctors, nurses, health workers and volunteers who are on the frontline of this emergency, and are risking their lives to save others. Support their heroic effort and grant them strength, generosity and continued health.

Be close to those who assist the sick night and day, and to priests who, in their pastoral concern and fidelity to the Gospel, are trying to help and support everyone.

Blessed Virgin, illumine the minds of men and women engaged in scientific research, that they may find effective solutions to overcome the virus.


Support national leaders, that with wisdom, solicitude and generosity they may come to the aid of those lacking the basic necessities of life and may devise social and economic solutions inspired by farsightedness and solidarity.

### **Mysteries of the Rosary**

### The Joyful Mystery (Monday and Saturday)

- 1. Annunciation: The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And, now you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High... (Luke 1:30-32)
- 2. Visitation: Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and exclaimed in a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1:41-42)
- 3. Birth of Jesus: The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11)
- 4. Presentation In The Temple: Simeon took him in his arms and praised God saying, "...my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all the people..." (Luke 2:28, 30-31)
- 5. Finding our Lord in the Temple: After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. (Luke 2:46-47)

### The Luminous Mystery (Thursday)

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan: And just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Mark 1:10-11)
- 2. The Wedding Feast of Cana: Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. (John 2:11)
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God: Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." (Mark 1:14-15)
- 4. The Transfiguration: While he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ...And from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen, listen to him!" (Luke 9:29, 35)
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist: While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and giving thanks he gave it to them saying, "Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." (Matthew 26:26-28)

### The Sorrowful Mystery (Tuesday and Friday)

- 1. The Agony in the Garden: Then Jesus withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:41-42)
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barrabas for them; and after flogging Jesus, handed him over to be crucified. (Mark 15:15)

- 3. The Crowning With Thorns: The soldiers clothed him in a purple cloak; and after twisting some thorns into a crown, they put it on him. And they began saluting him: "Hail, King of the Jews!" (Mark 15:17-18)
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross: Then Jesus said to them all, "If you want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23)
- 5. The Lord's Death Upon The Cross: And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him, and gave him the name that is above every name. (Philippians 2:8-9)

### The Glorious Mystery (Wednesday and Sunday)

- 1. The Resurrection of the Lord: Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in the newness of life. (Romans 6:4)
- 2. The Ascension into Heaven: So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. And they went out and proclaimed the Good News everywhere. (Mark 16:19-20)
- 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost: When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:1-4)
- 4. The Assumption of Mary: And Mary said, "...Surely, from now on all the generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name." (Luke 1:48-49)
- 5. The Crowning of Mary in Glory: When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then to the disciple, "Here is your mother." (John 19:26)
