

#### **BENEDICT XVI**

#### Prayer for the dead

32. The Eucharistic celebration, in which we proclaim that Christ has died and risen, and will come again, is a pledge of the future glory in which our bodies too will be glorified. Celebrating the memorial of our salvation strengthens our hope in the resurrection of the body and in the possibility of meeting once again, face to face, those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. In this context, I wish, together with the Synod Fathers, to remind all the faithful of the importance of prayers for the dead, especially the offering of Mass for them, so that, once purified, they can come to the beatific vision of God. (101) A rediscovery of the eschatological dimension inherent in the Eucharist, celebrated and adored, will help sustain us on our journey and comfort us in the hope of glory (cf. *Rom* 5:2; *Tit* 2:13).

It is that time of year again, to open our hearts and demonstrate Jesus' love through Operation Christmas Child (OCC). OCC is a program operated by Samaritan's Purse – Canada. It was started in 1993, to deliver shoeboxes filled with small gifts to children around the world who are suffering from war, famine, disease, extreme poverty, or natural disaster. The principles of Operation Christmas Child can be reflected by three simple, yet powerful, words -joy, faith, and compassion. □ **JOY**: To bring hope to children around the world, regardless of their race, religion, or gender, by giving them an unconditional gift to remind them they are loved and not forgotten. ☐ **FAITH**: To share the even greater gift of God's love – reflected in His Son Jesus Christ, the Christmas Child – through acts of love and kindness and when possible, through written and spoken word. □ **COMPASSION**: To foster compassion in Canadian children by expanding their world-view and teaching them it is truly greater to give than receive ("kids helping kids"). The Power of a Simple Gift will live on in a child forever. In 2018, more than 517,437 shoeboxes were collected in Canada; 27,334 of those came from Saskatchewan, and of those, 980 came from Estevan and area alone! Because of shoeboxes packed from people like you, 4,001,340 children enrolled in the Greatest Journey Discipleship Program, 2,024,615 made decisions for Christ, and 2,171,431 shared Jesus with or prayed for their friends and family. Each one of these unique gifts is a special reminder to the children that receive them that someone cares about them and God loves them. Please drop off your shoebox at the Alliance church before November 24th.
