Homily Corner



Last weekend, we celebrated the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Genesis 2:7ab, 15, 18-24, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 128, the second reading was Hebrews 2:9-11 and the Gospel reading was Mark 10:2-16.

We are entering into the beautiful month of October. We started with the Feast of the Guardian Angels on Saturday. God gave each of us a personal guardian angel to protect us and help us. It is very important to acknowledge them, thank them and praise God for them. October is a month of transformation in nature and it can also be an opportunity to transform our lives. Thanksgiving is on October 11, but at St. John the Baptist Parish, we will be celebrating Thanksgiving all month. We will have prayers to help us grow in an attitude of gratitude throughout the month. I encourage you to take some extra time in your daily life to think about who you need to thank intentionally in prayer. By being grateful people, thanking others and thanking God, his blessings will be upon us.

The Opening Prayer says, "Almighty ever-living God, who in abundance of your kindness surpass the merits and the desires of those who entreat you, pour out your mercy upon us to pardon what conscience dreads and to give what prayer does not dare to ask." God is ready to give us more than we can even ask for. He will even give us what we can't ask for. God is ready to provide to prayerful, grateful, reverent people.

In the first reading, we hear the creation narrative. God created everything. He created the human race. He created man and woman to become one flesh. The best love song you will ever hear is what Adam said to Eve, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh;". They are equal. And what God has made, no man should separate.

And in the Gospel, Jesus repeats the eternal truth we heard in the first reading. An eternal truth is something that is created by God, not by man. When you have time, go back and read the first reading and the Gospel reading again. God blesses us with this sacrament of the Holy Spirit. May we continue to live and celebrate the eternal truth, Jesus.

As we reflect on the holy scriptures this week, we should ask ourselves: How can I transform to have an attitude of gratitude? Do I live in the eternal truth?




God for His unbinding love, and prayerfully consider a donation that would show your love to His Church.
