## **Homily Corner**



Last weekend, we celebrated the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading was Wisdom 7:7-11, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 90, the second reading was Hebrews 4:12-13 and the Gospel reading was Mark 10:17-30.

We have been enjoying the eternal truth proclamation of God through Jesus for the past few weeks. The truth that is everlasting, for all time. Sometimes we might find the eternal truth offensive or harsh until we come to **know it** and **live it**.

Today's Gospel is the eternal truth, as well. And we know that sometimes it is hard to hear. I want to look at a few words that are used in the Gospel and explain how we should go forward with this message in our lives.

A man comes to Jesus because he wants "to inherit eternal life." Though he keeps the commandments, he still longs for a deeper experience of God. Recognizing the man's sincerity, Jesus looks at him with love and gives him three more commands: Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor. Jesus teaches that discipleship entails more than keeping rules. His followers must not value and work for what most people do. Rather, they seek what will last beyond the grave. Here we come to the first word I want to talk about, shocked. The man was shocked by Jesus' words and he thinks Jesus demands too much, because the man has many possessions. This is the second word I want to talk about, possessions. The man was immersed in the possession of wealth. That evil devil Satan was on that person. He was possessed by the accumulation of wealth. We too can be possessed by wealth. We even justify it by saying, "I worked hard for what I have. It is mine." But we need to remember that God gives us the gift of being hard working. He gives us the gifts of wealth. God knows we work hard. He sees us. He knows us.

When the grace of God is with us, we celebrate our gifts with praise and thanksgiving. Our joy and celebration is a gift of gratitude to God. Are you possessed by wealth? All that wealth came to you by God and it must be shared. How do you share with your family, your community, your Church? Coming out of the possession of wealth and sharing our gifts with others brings us to eternal life. Jesus is our example. He shared everything with the disciples. When we are holding onto our gifts, we are heavy. When we share, that weight on our soul is lifted. Our wealth will stay the same when we share, because we will always be rewarded.

As we reflect on the holy scriptures this week, we should ask ourselves: God gives us everything and more, are you sharing and utilizing your God-given gifts? What can you do now so you can enter into the eternal life perfectly and easily?


## PODCAST FRIDAYS

October is the Month of Thanksgiving at St. John the Baptist Parish

As our Parish Family continues to celebrate Thanksgiving, this week we are focusing on a tip from Jeff Cavins for cultivating gratitude in our lives.

Remember thankfulness is a holy discipline independent of feelings.

From a biblical perspective giving thanks to God is independent of feelings. We don't just wait until we have the feeling to thank God. We thank him whether we feel like it or not. Ephesians 5:19-20 says, "addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart, always and for everything giving thanks in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father." Notice St. Paul says "always and for everything". There are days we don't feel like praising God but Paul says always and for everything give thanks in the name of the Lord. So giving thanks is independent of feelings. Colossians 3:17 tells us, "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." A mature believer sees the hand of God in every circumstance in their life. Are you a mature believer? We challenge you to give thanks to God in your daily life no matter if you are struggling or celebrating. You might want to journal your reasons for thanksgiving, keeping track of where you have been and where you are going on your faith journey.
