We are truly blessed that our Church is open and we are grateful for all of our Parish Family who are looking our for each other and abiding by the directives that are in place. Please remember:



- You must sign up to attend a weekday or weekend Holy Mass. Please call, text or email Connie at 306-634-2190, 306-421-8447 or conniesjb@gmail.com.
- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you are required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, you are required to wear a mask to church.
- Social distancing will be adhered to.

Bulletin Reflection - 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time A

Isaiah 45:1,4-6 | 1Thess. 1:1-5a | Matt.22:15-21

For we all belong to God and all that we have belongs to God. It is only in "Giving to God what is God's", that we will find true happiness and fulfillment. Homily Corner



This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The first reading was Isaiah 25:6-10a, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 23, the second reading was Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20 and the Gospel reading was Matthew 22:1-14.

The first reading today assures us that God is always generous. He doesn't just give us what we need, but more than enough. How do we receive everything that is promised in the first reading? Through the sacraments. Growing in our faith and receiving the sacraments throughout our lives.

The parable in the Gospel today falls into two parts. The first and longest part describes a series of invitations to the King's wedding banquet for his son and the reactions they set off and the second part is a judgment scene.

In the first part, the wedding banquet is ready and he sends his slaves to call everyone that was invited. The people ignore the slaves and when the king sent other slaves to call his invitees again, some of them killed the slaves. The king then tells his slaves to go to streets of the city and invite everyone they can find. When the guests were gathered at the banquet, the king came in to see them and noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding robe. When I was young and I heard this Gospel at Mass, I always wondered why the man was kicked out of the banquet when he was invited. I have also been asked this question many times throughout the years. When you are invited somewhere, you receive an invitation and anything else the celebration requires. In Jesus' time, wedding robes would have been supplied to you as you arrived at the banquet as an invited guest. This man was certainly invited, but he didn't go through the right door to get the wedding robe.

In our world, the wedding banquet is the heavenly Kingdom and the wedding robe is the sacraments, especially baptism. When we are baptized, we are given a white garment while a prayer is said that tells us this garment is our assurance of salvation. We are clothed in Christ. We are told to keep this garment unstained. It is our invitation to the heavenly banquet. Our robe was cleansed by the blood of the lamb and this let us enter into the King's heavenly banquet.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, ask yourself, how am I generous? Do I share the gifts God has given me? How am I preparing myself for the heavenly banquet?
