



Bible Study

We are so excited about the next Bible Study on "Psalms: School of Prayer" beginning on Thursday, September 24th, 2020.



We hear the Psalms read or sung at every Mass between the first and second readings, but do we understand their significance?

The Psalms are at the heart of the Bible. They are prayers from God that help us learn to pray. The Holy Spirit inspired them. Israel sang them. Christ himself prayed them, as did our Blessed Mother. These sacred hymns become our heartfelt response to God's loving and wondrous deeds for us. *Psalms: The School of Prayer* is an eleven-week Bible study that will explore how the words of the Psalms captivate the imagination and draw us into a deeply personal encounter with God.

Participants of *Psalms: The School of Prayer* will meet every Thursday to view an engaging video presentation followed by a question and answer group discussion. Our *Psalms Bible Study* will begin on Thursday, September 24, 2020. There will be two sessions, one at 1:30pm and the other at 7:00pm. The sessions will end on December 3, 2020.

The registration will be limited to 30 people per session due to the Covid restrictions, so you'll want to register early for *Psalms*. It's going to be great!

Completed registration forms along with the \$60.00 registration fee can be placed in the collection basket at Holy Mass, dropped off at the Parish Office or you may call the Parish Office to make arrangements to register.

If the Covid-19 directives from the Provincial Government change due to a rise in cases, please be assured that we will continue with the Bible Study through some means. We are prayerfully working on a plan if this situation arises.



Directives For Attending the St. John the Baptist Parish Bible Study

We are excited to be offering this Bible Study and can't wait to see you there!!

All those attending the Bible Study do so at their own risk. It is important for individuals and families to take responsibility for protecting themselves and others.

Before Coming To The Study:

You must do this self-assessment before you come to the Study. The self-assessment is subject to change depending on the current situation and it will be emailed to you each week before the session. When you arrive, you will be asked if you have completed the self-assessment. If you have not, you will be asked the following questions:

- Do you have Covid-19 or do you live with someone with Covid-19?
- Have you been exposed to someone with Covid-19?
- Have you recently travelled outside of Canada?
- Do you have a fever, sore throat, cough, headache, aches and pains, chills, runny nose, loss
 of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Have you been a part of a gathering of more people than the Province of Saskatchewan recommends?
- Have you recently travelled outside of the province? The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- Have you had family visiting your home from other areas of the province or country? If
 yes, we ask that you seriously consider where your company has travelled from and who
 they have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you
 decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask
 during the 14 days from when you company arrived in your home.

If you answered yes to the first five questions, do not come to the Bible Study. Please contact Beckey Franke at 306-461-9559 to let her know you are unable to attend the session.

Entering The Church For Bible Study

- Only the front door of the Church will be unlocked.
- You will receive your workbook and nametag at the first session. Please bring this to every session. Otherwise, please keep what you bring with you from home limited.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the Parish Hall and you are also welcome to bring your own with you.
- All surfaces that are commonly touched will be disinfected after each session.
- Social distancing will be adhered to. The tables for each person will be set up 6 feet apart.
 Couples and family members can sit at the same table.
- Water bottles will be available as you come in for the session. We will not be offering coffee or tea during the sessions. A few candies will also be on each table.
- The sessions will begin with an introduction and opening prayer. Then we will watch the video followed by a question and answer period.
- Please touch as little as possible.

All Directives are subject to change depending on the Covid-19 situation in our area.

Holy Mass Updates

- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you are required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- If you have had out of province company staying in your home in the last 14 days, you are required to wear a mask to church.
- Social distancing will be adhered to.



Homily Corner



This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The first reading was Sirach 27:30-28:7, the Psalm was Psalm 103,the second reading was Romans 14:7-9 and the Gospel reading was Matthew 18:21-35.

None of us want to be angry or vengeful. We all want to be happy and joyful.

Sirach comes from the Wisdom books of the Bible, which also include the Psalms. This reading gives us clear instructions on how to be happy and joyful. We need wisdom, learning and understanding to be forgiving and to be joyful. How do we get the power of forgiveness? By understanding God's word and by showing mercy and forgiveness. The power of forgiveness comes from reading and praying God's Word. The Psalms are rich with prayers of regret, repentance, and forgiveness.

When we sin, we don't want anyone to know about it and we certainly don't want to be punished. When someone else sins, sometimes even our friends or family, we do tell other people and we want to see them punished. Even if their sin is less than ours. We judge them. Unfortunately, this is human nature. When we hold on to anger and judgment, it is us that is being hurt. We must melt that anger down so we can be happy and joyful. The best way we can do that is to **FORGIVE.** In my prayers, I say, "Lord, bless me with the grace of even just 1% of the forgiveness that you so abundantly give. Still sometimes I hold on to anger, but I continue to pray for a heart made of flesh and not of stone.

I think we are all familiar with Psalm 51. After committing a grave sin, King David was regretting his actions and singing this, which came to be Psalm 51. This Psalm still applies to our lives today.

The Gospel tells us that when we forgive others, we will also be forgiven.

Everyday we pray the Lord's Prayer. Did you know that each time we pray that prayer we make covenant with God? "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Quite often we break that covenant. If we haven't been forgiven by God, that is our problem. We did not forgive someone else. God gives us every opportunity to be forgiven.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, pray for those who you think need your forgiveness. Pray for all those who you hold anger against: "Lord, give me the strength to show forgiveness and kindness to others."
