Homily Corner

This past weekend we celebrated the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time and the first reading was Wisdom 9:13-18, the Responsorial Psalm was Psalm 90, the second reading was Philemon 9b-10, 12-17 and the Gospel reading was Luke 14:25-33.

Last weekend I explained the difference between humility and the **Virtue** of humility. The top tier or the premiere version of humility is the **Virtue of Humility**. It is looking after others more than looking after ourselves. When we practice the virtue of humility, we are investing in the kingdom of heaven.

This weekend our reflection continues. Jesus challenges us again. When we heard the readings just now, we may have thought that it is not practical to give up everything to follow Jesus. When we really look at the Gospel reading, we see that Jesus is speaking about the **Economy of Salvation**. The Catechism of the Catholic Church talks about the Economy of Salvation throughout the area about the seven sacraments. The household management of God's gifts is the Economy of Salvation. As I was praying and preparing this homily, I was thinking about this Economy of Salvation. Imagine we are going to live 100 years on earth. We work hard, have daily tasks, we constantly learn. We invest so much in these 100 years. But then imagine God's Kingdom, where will live for 100 000 years (Eternal Life). How much more should we be working, growing in our faith, to gain that Eternal Life? It is easy to have no virtues, no humility, to not invest in the kingdom. We can just live our daily lives but that will bring us unhappiness. Our challenge is to be a disciple of Christ and live our lives investing in order to gain the 100 000 years (Eternal Life).

How are we going to invest to give up our evil possessions? Does God say he doesn't want us to be happy? No. He wants us to go from **IDOL WORSHIP to IDEAL WORSHIP.**

Often times, we think God only speaks about heavenly things, but really God gives us everything. In the second part of the Gospel, Jesus gives us his vision by telling two stories about planning. When there is no vision, no strategy, we are living our lives like fools. We need to have a **Vision and Mission** in our personal life. Who would not sit down and plan in order to be successful in getting to their destination? We must have a very clear Mission and Vision; for us, our families, the organizations we belong to, and for our retirement. We need this certain investment to receive the 100 000 years. Father James Mallon, a great Canadian Catholic evangelist, says, **"Failure to plan is a plan to fail."** This is so true. Jesus is teaching us to plan strategically. We need to begin by getting a Mission and Vision for ourselves and then we can help our families.

Pray that you will be enlightened to have a vision to invest enough to live a life of 100 000 years.

This week as you spend time in quiet prayer, contemplate the economy of salvation. Read this Gospel

WAYS TO CONTRIBUTE

Thank you for being an active and valued member of the church. Being an active member shows your commitment to the Lord and your Parish Family.

An important tenet of our faith is giving and generosity. When you give, you invite abundance and blessings back into your life. However, we need your continued generosity to grow. We would like you to give some thought to when was the last time you increased your contribution. Was it possibly 5 to 10 years ago? Have you always given the same amount? Perhaps now is a good time to sit down with your family and come up with an updated plan on how you can help support your Parish.

There are many different ways that we offer for you to make a contribution to the parish.

- 2) Sending money via e-transfer. From the comfort of your home you can make your weekly contribution by sending it electronically to the Parish office. The email address to use is stjohnthebaptist@sasktel.net.
- 3) We would also encourage parishioners to utilize the AFT (Automatic Funds Transfer) for weekly/monthly/bi-weekly contributions. This is a simple process which ensures funds are consistently available to cover parish expenses. This way, you are still able to help support your parish, even if you are away or unable to attend Holy Mass.

PARISH FINANCIAL UPDATE 2022

We had budgeted our 2022 Sunday Collections to be \$450,000.00. At the end of **August** our collections total was \$251,411.15. To reach our budgeted goal we will need an additional \$198,588.85 which totals over \$49,000.00 /month for the next 4 months.




