

#### **Bible Study**

We are so excited about the next Bible Study on "Psalms: School of Prayer" beginning on Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020.



We hear the Psalms read or sung at every Mass between the first and second readings, but do we understand their significance?

The Psalms are at the heart of the Bible. They are prayers from God that help us learn to pray. The Holy Spirit inspired them. Israel sang them. Christ himself prayed them, as did our Blessed Mother. These sacred hymns become our heartfelt response to God's loving and wondrous deeds for us. *Psalms: The School of Prayer* is an eleven-week Bible study that will explore how the words of the Psalms captivate the imagination and draw us into a deeply personal encounter with God.

Participants of *Psalms: The School of Prayer* will meet every Thursday to view an engaging video presentation followed by a question and answer group discussion. Our *Psalms Bible Study* will begin on Thursday, September 24, 2020. There will be two sessions, one at 1:30pm and the other at 7:00pm. The sessions will end on December 3, 2020.

The registration will be limited to 30 people per session due to the Covid restrictions, so you'll want to register early for *Psalms*. It's going to be great!

Completed registration forms along with the \$60.00 registration fee can be placed in the collection basket at Holy Mass, dropped off at the Parish Office or you may call the Parish Office to make arrangements to register.

If the Covid-19 directives from the Provincial Government change due to a rise in cases, please be assured that we will continue with the Bible Study through some means. We are prayerfully working on a plan if this situation arises.



## <u>Directives For Attending the St. John the Baptist Parish Bible Study</u>

We are excited to be offering this Bible Study and can't wait to see you there!!

All those attending the Bible Study do so at their own risk. It is important for individuals and families to take responsibility for protecting themselves and others.

## **Before Coming To The Study:**

You must do this self-assessment before you come to the Study. The self-assessment is subject to change depending on the current situation and it will be emailed to you each week before the session. When you arrive, you will be asked if you have completed the self-assessment. If you have not, you will be asked the following questions:

- Do you have Covid-19 or do you live with someone with Covid-19?
- Have you been exposed to someone with Covid-19?
- Have you recently travelled outside of Canada?
- Do you have a fever, sore throat, cough, headache, aches and pains, chills, runny nose, loss of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing?
- Have you been a part of a gathering of more people than the Province of Saskatchewan recommends?
- Have you recently travelled outside of the province? The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- Have you had family visiting your home from other areas of the province or country? If
  yes, we ask that you seriously consider where your company has travelled from and who
  they have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you
  decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask
  during the 14 days from when you company arrived in your home.

If you answered yes to the first five questions, do not come to the Bible Study. Please contact Beckey Franke at 306-461-9559 to let her know you are unable to attend the session.

## **Entering The Church For Bible Study**

- Only the front door of the Church will be unlocked.
- You will receive your workbook and nametag at the first session. Please bring this to every session. Otherwise, please keep what you bring with you from home limited.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the Parish Hall and you are also welcome to bring your own with you.
- All surfaces that are commonly touched will be disinfected after each session.
- Social distancing will be adhered to. The tables for each person will be set up 6 feet apart.
   Couples and family members can sit at the same table.
- Water bottles will be available as you come in for the session. We will not be offering coffee or tea during the sessions. A few candies will also be on each table.
- The sessions will begin with an introduction and opening prayer. Then we will watch the video followed by a question and answer period.
- Please touch as little as possible.

All Directives are subject to change depending on the Covid-19 situation in our area.

#### **Holy Mass Updates**

- You must do the self-assessment before you arrive at the Church and have no symptoms of cough, cold, flu, or allergies. The self-assessment will be emailed to you the day before you are scheduled to attend a Holy Mass.
- The Province of Saskatchewan states that if you travel out of the province, you must self monitor for symptoms of Covid-19 for 14 days. During the 14 days, we ask that you seriously consider where you have travelled to and who you have been in contact with and whether it is safe for you to come to Church. If you decide that you are confident in coming to Church, you will be required to wear a mask during your 14 day self monitoring.
- If you have travelled to or through the West Central or Southwest parts of Saskatchewan in the past 14 days, we ask that you wear a mask to come to the Church.
- Social distancing will be adhered to.

#### **Update From Father Anthony**

Friends of Christ,

The good news to share is that as of September we will have a priest helping Torquay and Bienfait. Even though they have been blessed every weekend with Holy Mass, the time of the Holy Masses were not the best times for their Parish Families. Now they will have Sunday Masses at <a href="mailto:9AM">9AM</a> in Bienfait and at <a href="mailto:11AM">11AM</a> in Torquay. I will still be their pastor and will be looking after their spiritual and sacramental needs. The incoming priest will stay with me for a few months until his travelling options are opened. He has served this diocese for 10 years and now has to leave to return to his religious order. He helped the Estevan area a few years ago and lived in Estevan during that time.

He is Father Anthony Padayatti. He will have no position as assistant or associate but will be like a visiting priest. Once he is gone, the Archbishop has another retired priest in place to continue with the same system.

## **Homily Corner**



This is a recap of my homily from the previous weekend. This past Sunday's homily was on the readings for the 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time. The first reading was Jeremiah 20:7-9, the second reading was Romans 12:1-2 and the Gospel reading was Matthew 16:21-27.

In our regular life and our faith life, sometimes we have a complaint about God. Maybe he made us unhappy, maybe he humiliated us. Maybe our family makes fun of us because we come to Church and God is our priority.

When Jeremiah was called to be a prophet, he refused the first time, but God told him he would help him and protect him. So he finally agreed. Jeremiah spoke God's truth, but the people were so mean to him and so angry with him. He told God he felt like he had been manipulated. God promised him again that he would be with him. God held true to that promise and Jeremiah went on to become a great prophet.

In our lives, too, when we tell the truth, we will receive hatred and anger too. But what is our calling? Living in truth, proclaiming truth.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the truth. He tells the disciples that he will be spat on, hated, hit, tortured and crucified, but he says he has to endure all these things. He tells them that they may not want to hear that, but it is the truth and he will become the King of Kings. He tells Paul that if he wants to follow him, he must lose everything and then come to follow him.

Quite often I am asked about this scripture. People always want to know if they need to give up everything they have. To answer this, we must first believe that everything we are and everything we have is a God given grace. What this passage means is that we have to lose our pride, our hurts, our sins. We often times pretend we are something we are not. We take credit for things we didn't do. We hold onto past hurts. We sin and then justify it. Doing this makes us heavy, burdened. Our hearts become rocky and hard. We must lose our sinfulness, then we will be free to follow Jesus and live in his truth.

This week, as you spend time in quiet reflection, contemplate what you have to give up. What rocks are you holding in your heart? What is the heavy laden weight that I am carrying? How can I be weightless and follow the way, the truth and the life?

See you next week as we reflect on the 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time.
